

Your learning experience

We believe that everyone who has the ability should have the opportunity to study at university and we are strongly committed to your learning experience. We are proud to have been awarded the most improved student experience in the UK.¹

Ulster recognises that flexibility and convenience are important when it comes to your learning journey. That is why we offer a range of opportunities at a variety of levels to suit your lifestyle.

Academic year

Teaching is split into two or three semesters for most students (shorter courses may run for one). Each semester comprises of 12 weeks of teaching followed by an exam period. Students will typically study

three modules in each semester (18 modules of study make up a standard three-year degree programme).

To allow you to balance your academic studies with your personal life, you have the option to choose to study full-time during the evening and weekends* for postgraduate study (see page 54).

Successful completion of our undergraduate and postgraduate courses requires significant additional personal study time, but the reward is worth the effort.

Lectures, seminars and tutorials

Teaching is delivered through lectures, seminars and tutorials. Lectures are formal teaching sessions, often with a larger group of students. Seminars,

which usually provide a follow-up to lectures, take place in smaller groups and are often used to promote group discussion about a specific topic. In tutorials, a small number of students meet with a tutor to discuss work and to raise points of particular interest or difficulty.

Assessments

You will be assessed at each stage of your course. The purpose of assessments are to provide feedback on your progress and to further develop course content and teaching. Your learning will be assessed in the most appropriate way for each subject.

The Academic Community of Excellence (ACE) team have years of experience providing academic guidance to students of Ulster University Branch Campuses. Their areas of expertise include:

- How to write in an academic style
- Effective reading skills

During your time on campus, they will be there to support you in the following ways:

One-to-one tutorials

The BSc (Hons) Accounting with Management creates the opportunity to progress your studies within growing areas of professional services.

This course provides a comprehensive grounding in theory and practice, and an excellent foundation to becoming a qualified Accountant.

It provides an opportunity to secure exemptions from the major Professional Accountancy Bodies, whilst keeping many options open to successful graduates to pursue other careers involving accounting, business and finance.

You will have the opportunity to develop knowledge, skills and insight in the following areas:

- The concepts and theories of accounting within a broad economic, legal, social and professional environment
- The basic principles of auditing, investment, finance, taxation and their implications for individuals, organisations, markets, societies and other disciplines
- Alternative recognition rules and valuation bases
- The recording, preparation, presentation and analysis of financial information
- Business and financial information, technology and systems, and professional ethics
- Qualitative and quantitative analysis of accounting data.

OVERVIEW

The aim of the course is to provide a broadly based education in computing systems. It will produce graduates equipped to apply best practice in software engineering to the development of a wide range of information systems in organisations. The course will also help meet the industry's current shortage of high quality graduates in computing, particularly those with software development skills.

The course recognises that software development skills need to be complemented with people and process related skills. Consequently, people, process and professional practice are important topics and allow the development of a broad base of skills.

The recent computing research landscape has seen topics come to the fore on security and the role of artificial intelligence in society, both of which feature in the programme.

PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

Graduates from this course have been successful in gaining full membership of the British Computer Society, the Chartered Institute for IT.

CAREER AND PROGRESSION OPTIONS

Upon graduation, students will be eligible to embark on a professional career in computing or to undertake further study at Masters or PhD level. Career routes include:

- Designing business-critical computer systems
- Providing consultancy on computing systems development
- Managerial roles with responsibility for an organisation's computing resources.

Our extended Masters programmes have been specifically designed to provide a bridging route for students who require extra support to meet the initial entry requirement of their target Masters degree.

MONTH 1-3

Graduate Certificate stage:

- 3 modules need to be completed successfully:
 - Research Methods for Postgraduate Studies
 - Academic Essentials
 - Enterprise Development
- Upon successful completion of this programme you will have gained the confidence and core skills to progress on to one of our MSc International Business or MSc Marketing programmes.

MONTH 4-15

Masters stage:

- You will complete a Masters programme in your chosen subject
- You will be taught through a mixture of lectures, seminars, workshops and visited by industry expert speakers

OVERVIEW

If you require extra support before undertaking Masters level study, the Graduate Certificate will provide you with a solid foundation and the skills required for postgraduate study.

The programme lasts for one semester and consists of three modules designed to develop your academic study and English language skills.

You will have the opportunity to develop knowledge, skills and insight in the following areas:

- The learning styles required for academic purposes at postgraduate level
- Problem-solving and decision-making skills to draw reasoned conclusions from data and make appropriate recommendations
- The ability to use academic literature and a wide range of research and evaluation methods
- Using a wide range of research methods to critically evaluate concepts, arguments and evidence in an objective manner.

CAREER AND PROGRESSION OPTIONS

Students who successfully complete the Graduate Certificate and, on achieving a minimum average of 50% across all modules, will be in a position to progress on to one of our Masters programmes in London or Birmingham.

Progression onto the MBA is conditional on passing the Graduate Certificate with an overall pass mark of at least 50% at the first attempt and normally the possession of two years relevant work experience. This is not available as an Extended programme.



FIRST 2 SEMESTERS

The MBA is a general management course aimed at aspiring and established middle managers from a range of business sectors. The course has been designed to account for current (local, regional and international) market trends and has recently been updated to provide additional flexibility, choice and the opportunity to apply taught management skills. Therefore, students will:

- Develop multidisciplinary and international perspectives, concepts and issues in the major management disciplines
- Gain an understanding of relevant toolkits and techniques for analysing business and management issues
- Cultivate the ability to analyse, synthesise and apply knowledge and understanding to solve management problems critically, rationally and rigorously.

ADVANCED PRACTICE

If you decide to study with Advanced Practice, this stage will take place after your first 2 semesters. It will enable you to undertake a 15-week long internship, or Applied Consulting Project, working with a real organisation on a live business problem. OVERVIEW

The MSc in Strategic Accounting combines preparation for ACCA Membership with the development of essential skills for accounting in a global context with consideration to the findings of the research paper 'Professional Accountants - the future: Drivers of Change and Future Skills' (ACCA 2016).

Not only will you study modules that are 100% aligned to the ACCA syllabus, but there will also be an opportunity for you to develop highly valued skills in the areas of Cyber Security or Data Analytics. This programme therefore helps prepare you both to become a professional accountant and for the future challenges and opportunities that the profession will face.

The ACCA predicts that the landscape in which accountants work will be impacted by 'drivers' - of regulation and governance, digital technology, expectation and globalisation - and those accountants who are able to integrate their technical and leadership competences with these drivers will be highly valued by organisations worldwide.

In the final stage of this programme, you will choose to either complete a Dissertation, investigating an accounting issue of your choice, or a Strategic Business Project, where you work on a project relevant to the financial services sector in a work-based context. Completing the Strategic Business Project will cover part of ACCA's 36 month Practical Experience Requirement.

The teaching and learning in the ACCA related modules (Strategic Business Reporting, Strategic Business Leader, Advanced Performance Management, Advanced Audit and Assurance, Advanced Taxation and Advanced Financial Management) will prepare students to take the ACCA exams in these papers. Students will need to sit the ACCA exams outside of the MSc Strategic Accounting to obtain the ACCA accreditation.

CAREER AND PROGRESSION OPTIONS

The programme provides a solid foundation for students wishing to commence or continue a career in the accounting profession whether in professional practice, industry, the public sector, the charity sector, financial services or professional services.

Aspirational career opportunities for ACCA qualified accountants would be senior positions which require individuals to apply technical financial knowledge with that of leadership, stakeholder management, creative and innovative thinking. The successful completion of the MSc in Strategic Accounting alongside ACCA membership will demonstrate these competences and capabilities, and how you as a professional can contribute to organisational performance.

Evening and weekend study

One of our study options available for UK/Home students includes evenings and weekends. This study option offers exactly the same levels of student support and the ability to balance your full-time studies with your personal life, but what does this actually mean?

What would a typical week look like?

Evening and weekend study provides you with the ability to have flexibility with your personal commitments alongside your studies.

You are expected to attend 12 hours of classes per week on campus, and an additional 23-30¹ hours of self-study per week.

Your typical week on campus could look like this:

2 evenings per week: 5.45pm – 8.30pm


1 weekend day per week: 9.30am – 3.00pm

Can I still apply for Student Finance?

Your course is classed as a full-time course, with your classes taking place during evening and weekend hours. As a result, and subject to eligibility, you can apply for a loan through Student Finance England. Please see 'Fees and funding' on page 56 for more information and eligibility criteria.

Is this option available for every programme?

The evening and weekend study option is not available for Advance Practice programmes or for undergraduate and pre-masters courses. You can find information regarding each course on our website.



Can I access the university campus outside my study hours?

Yes you can. As an evening and weekend study student, you will still receive the exact same support and access to university resources as students who study weekdays. Our campuses offer flexible opening hours to meet your study needs.

If you are resident in the UK and are applying for a full-time undergraduate course then you may also qualify for a maintenance loan.

Although admissions requirements may be expressed as Advanced Level qualifications, offers can also be made at the equivalent level for applicants offering a BTEC or a combination of qualifications. For many programmes of study, applicants may be able to satisfy the requirement for one of the A Level grades (or equivalent) by substituting a combination of alternative qualifications to the same standard as defined by UCAS.

Applicants are encouraged to provide all qualifications that attract UCAS tariff points in their application. These qualifications may be considered by the University should conditional offer grades be narrowly missed.

Important information for International applicants

If you are applying to study a new programme in the UK and have previously studied in the UK using a Student Route or Tier 4 (General) Student visa, the new programme must represent academic progress from your previous study.

The Student Route Policy Guidance states that in order to show academic progression, your new programme must normally be above the level of the previous course for which you were given a Student Route or Tier 4 visa.

If the course you are applying for is not at a higher level than your previous course, there are exceptions to this rule where the University (the Student Route Sponsor) confirms that the new course is related to the previous course for which you were given a Student Route or Tier 4 visa and involves deeper specialisation of your chosen subject; or your previous and new course combined support your career aspirations.

You will be required to articulate how the new course demonstrates academic progression for you in the form of a personal statement. You should outline which modules you previously studied at this level and how they have prepared you for study at Ulster. Ulster Admissions staff will carry out a full assessment and may ask for additional information if it is not clear that you satisfy the UKVI requirements on academic progression.
