Through the oldest of our four Colleges, Whitelands, the University of Roehampton has been providing higher education to women longer than any other University in the country.

Roehampton is comprised of four historic Colleges: Digby Stuart, Froebel, Southlands and Whitelands, which were all formed in the 19th century. When you join Roehampton as a student, you will become a member of one of them.

Your College will become your local community. Each College has a thriving social scene and its own sports teams; they help create a healthy sense of competition and college pride.

Our values come from our rich history, built on community, engagement and partnership, with a belief that no matter your background, we can help realise your ambitions.



Digby Stuart College

Digby Stuart College was first established in 1874 as a women's teacher training college. Today Digby Stuart is home to some of our newest facilities, including our Media Hub, Welcome Centre and Library.



Froebel College

Founded in 1892, the ethos of the College is based on the philosophy of Friedrich Froebel. The College is based within and around Grove House, which dates back to 1792.



Southlands College

Southlands College opened on 26 February 1872 as a training college for women teachers. The College is committed to the causes of equality, social justice and community engagement.



Whitelands College

Founded in 1841 as a teachers' training college, it is among the oldest higher education institutions in England, and one of the very first to provide education for women. Today it occupies a beautiful 14-acre site overlooking London's Richmond Park.

Library


Our award-winning library houses 1,200 study spaces and hundreds of thousands of books and research materials across nearly 8,000 metres of shelving and five floors.




Acres of green space

Research at Roehampton



At Roehampton, we develop ideas that help us to understand our world. With international reach, our research informs policy, enriches culture and improves people's lives.

When you join us, you will be taught by leading experts right from your first year of study. Our staff carry out world-class research, from discovering new animal species to uncovering evidence about human history.

In the 2014 national audit of research quality, the Research Excellence Framework (REF), we were ranked the most research-intensive modern university in the country.



Dr Chris Tyler, Reader in Environmental Physiology, has appeared on Sky News discussing the impact of football players performing in extreme heat, following the delay of the 2020 Premier League to the summer months.

His research focuses on how humans respond and adapt to extreme environmental challenges and how exercise is performed in extremely hot and cold temperatures, as well as the role that cooling interventions play in reducing physiological strain and improving exercise performance.



Roehampton's Professor Aisha K. Gill, PhD, CBE, launched a successful crowdfund for domestic violence victims during the Covid-19 pandemic.

As well as working with a number of women's charities supporting at-risk BME and refugee women during the 2020 lockdown, Professor Gill's contribution to the Prime Minister's Virtual Summit helped to inform the government's thinking on policing domestic abuse and honour-based violence during the pandemic, as well as the proactive policing response to domestic abuse more broadly.



Professor Molly Scott Cato, Professor of Green Economics and former Green MEP for South West England, has been leading talks to discuss the future of environmental policy and what the global pandemic means for the planet.

Professor Cato has spent several decades developing the discipline of Green Economics, with the aim of ensuring economic success does not threaten the environment. This includes work on policies in sustainable finance to shift investment away from fossil fuels and towards renewables and sustainable sectors.



The Before Shakespeare research project, led by Roehampton's Dr Andy Kesson, has been exploring the origins of London's commercial theatre, which dates back to the mid-sixteenth century.

In partnership with leading organisations such as Shakespeare's Globe, and taking advantage of the archaeological remains of the original playhouse, the £250,000 project is helping change people's understanding of the beginnings of theatre and playhouses in the UK.

We are here to help at every stage of your journey, so nothing can get in the way of your success. We offer a range of support, from academic learning support to student counselling and an on-site medical centre. All of our support services can be accessed via our campus information centre. If you need support while you're with us, rest assured you'll find plenty on offer.



Learning support

Disability and dyslexia services

If you have a disability, a long-term medical condition or a specific learning difference such as dyslexia, dyspraxia or ADHD, we offer specialist services if you ever need extra help. You can discuss your needs confidentially with our team, to explore the support you may need during your studies. We also offer regular appointments and drop-in sessions weekly.

English language support

As an international student, you might want help to improve your English while you study. We can help you build your skills through activities such as writing assignments and giving presentations, that will be useful even after graduation. The Academic Achievement team

Our team of Academic Achievement Advisers and Librarians can help you get the best out of your studies. We have a wide range of online resources covering just about everything you need to know about academic and library skills including:

- Referencing
- SPSS, statistics and data management

You can access all these whenever you need them, anytime, anywhere.

We also run drop-ins, pop-up skills sessions, essay clinics, practical workshops and other events throughout the year, based in the University's library.

Studiosity

Studiosity is Roehampton's online academic study guidance service that will review the structure, grammar, language and standard referencing practices of your work. The service allows you to upload your work at any time of the day or night, and receive feedback within 24 hours.



Wellbeing support

Chaplaincy

Our multi-faith chaplaincy celebrates the diversity of Roehampton by serving the religious and spiritual needs of all. Each Chaplaincy Centre has a cosy lounge area, where you can relax, meet up with friends and enjoy chaplaincy hospitality with a Fairtrade tea or coffee. We also organise social events, including lunches and film nights.

Medical centre

We have our own on-campus NHS run student medical centre, offering doctor and nurse-led services throughout term time.

Student Wellbeing Officers

The Wellbeing Service is able to support you during your studies. The Student Wellbeing Officers can help with anything from dealing with personal issues to managing finances. There is also a Counselling Team to help you address personal or emotional difficulties. The Mental Health Advisers can support those with mental health conditions or those with concerns about their mental health.

College Wardens

If you are a student living on campus, you can access support out of hours from our College Warden Team. College Wardens offer confidential wellbeing support between 6pm and 8am Monday – Friday and all day throughout the weekend.



Financial support

We offer a range of financial support, including generous scholarships, a Student Hardship Fund for those in financial difficulty, access to undergraduate and postgraduate student loans and personal advice on budgeting.



International students

We are very proud of our diverse and multicultural student body, and this is embodied in our various culture-based events, clubs and societies.

Our students enjoy living and learning on a beautiful green campus whilst making the most of all the leisure, cultural, sporting and networking opportunities London offers. Roehampton offers guaranteed university accommodation to international students who apply by the deadline.

Study abroad for international students

During your degree at Roehampton, you could be studying in Australia or the USA for a semester, doing a work placement in China or studying in Spain during the summer break. Travel, explore and study alongside students from Roehampton's worldwide partner institutions, whilst increasing your employability. Studying abroad enhances your CV and gives you that much-needed edge when applying for jobs.

International Foundation Programme

Designed specifically for international students, the International Foundation Programme (IFP) offers a pathway from your current overseas qualifications to your chosen University of Roehampton undergraduate degree.

The course focuses on building confidence with your everyday English language, alongside study skills needed for undergraduate success. On passing the programme, you'll have the opportunity to progress on to one of our many undergraduate degrees in subject areas such as Accounting, Business, Education, Journalism, Psychology, Social Sciences, Sport and more.

If English is not your first language:

International students who don't speak English as their native language are offered free English language support during their studies.

Pre-sessional English language courses

These courses are ideal for students who are offered a place on an undergraduate course, but still need to meet academic English requirements. You will improve your academic English so you can cope better with university study, develop your study skills and learn what is expected of you as a student in the UK higher education system.

With connections to Wimbledon Squash Club and Roehampton Club, which is next door to campus, there are plenty of opportunities to train on the court.

- The O2 Shepherd's Bush Empire is a great live music venue, hosting touring artists from all over the world.




Green spaces

Career ready



Accommodation

Helping you make an informed choice

At our Open Days held throughout the year, you can visit our campus accommodation. You can also see pictures and 360 degree tours on our accommodation pages online.

When you're planning your future education, you don't want any worries to get in the way. That's why **we offer you an accommodation guarantee**. This means, if you make Roehampton your firm choice on your UCAS form, satisfy the eligibility criteria and meet the deadline[†], we promise you'll have on-campus accommodation.

Accommodation applications typically open in the February before you arrive for your first year, and you can apply once you have firmly accepted an offer of a place from us.

Types of accommodation

We offer a wide range of accommodation on-campus. Every room is a single furnished bedroom with internet access, and fees include utility bills and contents insurance. Rooms are either en suite, semi en suite (with a private shower) or standard where you share bathroom facilities with other students. All rooms have a wash basin.

On-campus cost

The cost of rooms varies, depending on the type of accommodation you choose. For first year undergraduates, this ranges from £128 – £188 a week.*

Living off-campus

Living in or near Roehampton, you can benefit from all that London has to offer, while avoiding the high costs of living in the centre of the city. There is a wide variety of accommodation suitable for students available to rent close to the University.

If you choose to live away from the University, our Off-Campus Support Officer can help you find accommodation with other students in a similar situation.

Even if you are living off campus, or choose to live at home, you will still feel part of the Roehampton community. There are lots of activities and societies you can get involved with when you are on campus.

At Roehampton, we believe in helping our students to develop the confidence, knowledge and adaptability they need for a successful graduate career and fulfilling life, which is why we offer an extended degree option for many of our undergraduate programmes.

What is an extended degree?

Our extended degrees are four-year programmes which provide an additional year at the beginning of the degree that builds your confidence in your abilities, develops essential academic and study skills, and provides you with subject specific knowledge as a basis for success in your following three years. You will complete core modules as well as an extended project which will develop your skills in carrying out research, using scholarly sources, drawing comparisons between your own research and that of others, and documenting your findings.

We will provide you with a thorough grounding in study skills, including how to structure an essay, referencing and how to use library resources like journals. We will also help you to develop your reading, academic writing and your presentational skills.

Who should apply for an extended degree?

Extended degrees at Roehampton are a great option if you don't have traditional qualifications or do not meet the requirements to go straight onto an undergraduate degree.

How is the degree structured?

During the first year, we teach over two semesters – Autumn and Spring. You will complete six modules in total. The modules have been designed to equip you with the key skills needed to complete the degree you choose.

In Autumn, you will complete modules in Academic English as well as subject-area modules. In Spring, you will complete modules in Academic English, subject-area modules as well as a Disciplinary Investigation.

Once you have completed and passed these modules at the end of Year 0, you will be ready to move into the first year of your degree, along with a network of friends and peers across our seven academic departments.



How to apply

Most students applying for undergraduate study will do so via UCAS (ucas.com).

You can apply for up to five courses at UK higher education institutions using the UCAS service. Please note that UCAS do charge a fee for submitting an application using this route. Once we receive your application from UCAS, we aim to make a decision on it within a few days.

Once you have heard back from all the institutions you have applied to, you need to decide which application will be your 'firm' choice (first choice) and your 'insurance' choice (second choice). During the time it takes for you to make your decision, we will contact you by email, phone and occasionally by post with more information about studying with us.

You may submit late applications; usually this is by the end of June; however, please be aware that if courses become full, we may not be able to make offers on late applications. After the June deadline, you will only be able to make an application via the UCAS Clearing service.

International students have the option to apply using the application form on our website at any point in the year.

There is no charge to make an application via this route.

The tuition fees are set annually, and are different for home, EU and international students.

No fees up front

You can apply for a tuition fee loan from the government if you live in England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland, are classified as a home student and you have secured a place in higher education for studying your first degree.

EU students should check our website for the latest information on fees and tuition fee loans.

Support with living costs

Home students are also eligible for a maintenance loan from the government to help with living costs. Part of the loan is income assessed and the amount you receive will depend on factors such as if you choose to live away from home or not.

If you apply to Roehampton, you will be eligible for a larger loan because the University is based in London. The maximum loan for 2020 entry is currently £12,010. For the most up-to-date information, please see:

When do I repay the tuition fee and maintenance loans?

You don't start repaying any loans until the April after graduation and only once you are working and earning more than £25,000 a year.

If your income drops below this threshold at any point then your repayments would also stop. You repay 9% of your income above £21,000. After 30 years, any outstanding loan is written off.

Depending on your individual circumstances, you may also be eligible for extra support from the government in the form of bursaries and grants.

Scholarships and bursaries

The University of Roehampton currently offers a range of scholarships including:

Academic Excellence Scholarship: Undergraduate, first-degree students who perform strongly in A-levels, the International Baccalaureate and equivalent qualifications could qualify for up to £3000.

Getting here

The University of Roehampton campus benefits from being at the heart of a busy network of transport links. Whether using buses, the tube network at Putney, or through rail services from Barnes to Waterloo, all points across central and west London are within easy reach of the University.

Bus

The 265, 419 and 493 buses stop outside the University's main entrance; Froebel College (Queen Mary's Hospital bus stop) and a short walk from the entrance to Whitelands College (Roehampton Lane, Danebury Avenue bus stop).

If you are travelling to the Whitelands Campus, the 85, 170 and 430 bus also stop near the entrance. You can see bus routes and track live bus arrivals on the TfL website.

National Rail

The nearest station is Barnes – 8 trains per hour go to Putney, Clapham Junction, Vauxhall and London Waterloo.

Barnes station is a 15 minute walk from the University main entrance, or you can take the 265 bus which stops outside all campuses.

Tube

We are a short bus ride away from tube connections at Putney Bridge (District).

If coming from Putney Bridge, take bus 265.

Cycle

Alternatively you can create your own route and timetable by commuting to Roehampton by bike. There are more than 600 cycle spaces dotted around campus.

Car
