We believe that a university education is not just about getting a great degree, but also broadening your experiences, preparing yourself for the world of work, and making lifelong friendships.


A Roehampton degree is designed to ensure that you graduate with the qualities you need to succeed: confidence, adaptability and the capacity to work with people from all walks of life.

Through the oldest of our four Colleges, Whitelands, the University of Roehampton has been providing higher education to women longer than any other University in the country.

Roehampton is comprised of four historic Colleges: Digby Stuart, Froebel, Southlands and Whitelands, which were all formed in the 19th century. When you join Roehampton as a student, you will become a member of one of them.

Digby Stuart College

Froebel College

Founded in 1892, the ethos of the College is based on the philosophy of Friedrich Froebel. The College is based within and around Grove House, which dates back to 1792.



Southlands College


Southlands College opened on 26 February 1872 as a training college for women teachers. The College is committed to the causes of equality, social justice and community engagement.



Whitelands College

Founded in 1841 as a teachers' training college, it is among the oldest higher education institutions in England, and one of the very first to provide education for women. Today it occupies a beautiful 14-acre site overlooking London's Richmond Park.

Shopping

When you need a little retail therapy, Roehampton is well placed to shop.

Food & Drink

There are so many places to go for food locally, from street food to upmarket bars and restaurants. You can head to Tooting Market for a huge variety of street food, Richmond for a cool drink by the river or jump on a bus to Putney, Fulham and Chelsea for even more options!

Accommodation applications typically open in the February before you arrive for your first year, and you can apply once you have firmly accepted an offer of a place from us.

Types of accommodation

We offer a wide range of accommodation on-campus. Every room is a single furnished bedroom with internet access, and fees include utility bills and contents insurance. Rooms are either en suite, semi en suite (with a private shower) or standard where you share bathroom facilities with other students. All rooms have a wash basin.

On-campus cost

The cost of rooms varies, depending on the type of accommodation you choose. For first year undergraduates, this ranges from £128 – £188 a week.

Living off-campus

Living in or near Roehampton, you can benefit from all that London has to offer, while avoiding the high costs of living in the centre of the city. There is a wide variety of accommodation suitable for students available to rent close to the University.

If you choose to live away from the University, our Off-Campus Support Officer can help you find accommodation with other students in a similar situation. Even if you are living off campus, or choose to live at home, you will still feel part of the Roehampton community. There are lots of activities and societies you can get involved with when you are on campus.

Living costs

Aside from your course fees, there are additional costs you should take into consideration when budgeting for university. This is a rough guide.

The above costs are a rough indication only and are accurate at the time of printing. Individual costs will vary.

Travel costs

This will vary depending on how often you travel, and which modes of transport you take. The Hopper fare in London allows you to make unlimited bus or tram journeys

in one hour, for £1.55 using pay as you go. As a student you can also choose to save 30% on travel cards and bus & tram passes with an 18+ Student Oyster photocard.



Please note: You will need UKVI IELTS, Persons or Trinity test results if you are applying for a single CAS for the International Foundation Programme. To be eligible to apply for a 4 Year CAS to cover both the International Foundation Programme and your undergraduate degree you will need to have an IELTS 5.5 (with a minimum of 5.5 in all elements).

Course overview

The International Foundation Programme is specifically designed to build your English language, academic study skills and subject knowledge to the level required to progress on to an undergraduate degree.

There are 3 different module combinations available for you to choose between:

Business Innovation + Humanities and Social Science in Action	to progress onto sports and arts, business, computing, humanities, law and accounting undergraduate degrees
Life Sciences in Action + Scientific Thinking	to progress on to an undergraduate degree onto anthropology and science undergraduate degree
Scientific Thinking + Humanities and Social Science in Action	to progress onto psychology and social anthropology degrees

What will I study?

3 term programme:

Throughout this term you will improve your language confidence levels in grammar and vocabulary as well as core English skills in reading, writing and listening to prepare you for the first term of the International Foundation Programme. You will only study term zero if you are on our three term programme.

3 & 2 term programme:

In terms one and two, you will continue to develop your English language skills, however, more of your time will be spent on improving your English language levels for subject specific undergraduate courses.

These modules are specifically designed to improve your ability to write essays, read for your studies, develop your ability to understand lectures, and take part in discussions and presentations and prepare you for undergraduate study.

How will I be taught?

- 20 hours teaching time in lectures and seminars
- 20 hours of independent study (25 for assessment weeks)
- 20–30 minute one-to-one tutorials during the project and subject modules

About the programme

- Study alongside other like-minded international students
- Gradually adjust to life in the UK and academic study
- Explore and learn subject knowledge relevant to your undergraduate degree



Course overview

The programme has been specifically designed for you and other like-minded international students who are looking for a tailored route of study, with more help and guidance, before joining year two of undergraduate study. It gives you an opportunity to gradually familiarise yourself with the UK learning requirements in a supportive and encouraging environment, allowing you to develop and grow as a new academic learner.

A key feature of studying the programme is that you become a full student of the Roehampton Business School and as such, you will be invited to join guest speaker events, conferences, staff student committees and have full access to all the facilities, software and materials to prepare you for year two study. This approach ensures that you feel part of the student community and gives you the opportunity to widen your academic and social friendship groups to develop long lasting relationships within the University.

What will I study?

The modules you will study are mapped to those in Roehampton Business School undergraduate degrees and will develop your subject knowledge in areas such as management, marketing, accounting and analytics. For those of you who intend to join the Accounting degree you will study a module 'Accounting for Organisations', which prepares you for further exemptions for industry bodies such as ACCA and CIMA.

A key module that supports you throughout your journey is the Business Academic Skills module. You will begin this module with an extended introduction in academic English, business language and everyday social English all of which is designed to build your confidence and language proficiency to get ready for learning new business knowledge. Within all the modules you will apply academic theories to real life situations, enabling you to develop your critical thinking skills.

- 15–20 hours of self-study per week
- Access to our virtual learning environment to prepare for lessons and support for assignments

Progression to degree level study

Following successful completion of your programme, subject to a 40% pass mark, you will be able to progress onto the second year of all Roehampton Business School undergraduate degrees.

If you have the equivalent of IELTS 5.5 overall with no sub score below 5.5 you will be able to apply for a joint CAS for the whole of your foundation and undergraduate study at Roehampton. This means you will only need to apply for your student visa once for your entire UK study with no additional English testing requirements.







By Bus

Buses run frequently to Roehampton from Richmond, Kingston, Putney, Clapham Junction, Wimbledon and New Malden.

The 265 and 493 buses stop next to the main site (at Queen Mary's Hospital) and close to Whitelands and Mount Clare (at the junction of Danebury Avenue). The 170 and 430 buses stop on Danebury Avenue, which is very close to Whitelands and Mount Clare and a short walk from the main site.

By Train

The main site is a 10 minute walk from Barnes station, Whitelands College is a 25 minute walk or a short bus ride. Trains go to Barnes from Clapham Junction and Waterloo in one direction and Kingston, Richmond, Staines and Windsor in the other direction.
