

# Health and Social Care BSc (Hons) (including foundation year)

## About this course

### Health and Social Care BSc (Hons) Three-year degree:

This programme is designed to help you develop the skills, knowledge and confidence to start a professional career in the health and social care sector over three years. The programme is aligned to the standards specified by Skills for Health (the Sector Skills Council for the NHS) and upon completion of the course, you'll be able to demonstrate to prospective employers that your advanced skills conform to the National Occupational Standards (NOS).

### Health and Social Care (including foundation year) BSc (Hons) – Four-year degree:

This course has a built-in foundation year (Year 0) that provides you with an alternative route into higher education if you need extra support to meet the entry requirements for an undergraduate degree.

This course is fully accredited by the Chartered Institute of Housing (CIH), so if you choose to specialise in housing you'll receive free student membership of the CIH.

### London Metropolitan University partnership

The Health and Social Care (including foundation year) BSc (Hons) is awarded by London Metropolitan University. You will be registered as a student of London Metropolitan University. The programme is taught by QA Higher Education, a UK higher education provider.

Each year of the course identifies a particular stage of student development. Beginning in year one as The Inquiring Student, the second year casts students as Emerging Practitioners before students become Effective Graduates by the end of the course.

You can expect to delve into how to think critically, explore introductory ideas around the themes of self and society amongst other modules to get you right on track for your further studies.

The Personal and Professional Development modules also contribute to the development of student employability. Self-management and empowering activities within these modules develop the values and skills necessary to work effectively in models of service delivery that are themselves empowering.

<b>Entry requirements</b>	112 UCAS points:  A minimum of grades BBC in three A levels (or from an equivalent Level 3 qualification, such as BTEC National or Advanced Diploma)	32 UCAS points:  At least one A-Level (or from equivalent level 3 qualification, such as BTEC/Subsidiary/National/BTEC Extended Diploma)
<b>English language requirements</b>	GCSE English Language at grade C/4 or above (or equivalent). Alternatively, applicants can sit the QA Higher Education English test.
