STUDY YOUR WAY





BSC (HONS) COMPUTING (WITH FOUNDATION YEAR)



Develop your interests and pursue a career in Computing with the BSc (Hons) Computing (with Foundation Year). Studying this programme focuses on the technical aspects of computing, allowing you to gain the necessary knowledge to begin a successful computing career.

IT STARTS HERE

Available as both 3 and 4-year programmes, the 4-year programme includes the addition of a foundation year, ideal for students who wish to increase their knowledge of computing prior to the undergraduate degree. This benefits students who lack the formal qualifications for direct entry onto the degree programme.

The undergraduate programme has a large focus on programming. During these 3 years of study, you will attain a range of information surrounding databases, usability and web technologies, and networking, as well as gaining a set of transferable skills such as communication, teamwork and project management.

ONE-TO-ONE TUTORIALS



As an undergraduate student, you'll have two main types of expenses – tuition fees and your living costs. Some courses also have additional or optional costs – for field visits or equipment, for example – and you can find details of these on our course pages.

TUITION FEES

Eligible home students from England can apply for a loan from Student Finance England (SFE) to cover tuition fees.* This loan doesn't depend on your household income and is paid directly to the University on your behalf. You only need to start paying this loan back when you are earning more than £25,000 per year.

MAINTENANCE LOANS

Eligible home students, including those under the EU settlement scheme can apply for a loan to support them while they study which will be paid into their bank account in three instalments at the beginning of each academic term.

The amount available depends on:

- Where you live while studying.
- Your assessed ('means-tested') family income.
- Your entitlement to state benefits.

LIVING COSTS

It's important that you are aware of your everyday costs as a student and how these differ from city to city.

Your day-to-day costs cover everything from accommodation and utility bills to entertainment and food costs.

As a rough guide, you can expect the following monthly costs in each of the city locations in which we offer courses:

ADDITIONAL COSTS

In addition to the tuition fees, you should be prepared to buy some of the course textbooks which are around ± 30 each. This would average around ± 200 per annum.
