History of Roehampton

Through the oldest of our four Colleges, Whitelands, the University of Roehampton has been providing higher education to women longer than any other University in the country.

Roehampton is comprised of four historic Colleges: Digby Stuart, Froebel, Southlands and Whitelands, which were all formed in the 19th century. When you join Roehampton as a student, you will become a member of one of them.

Your College will become your local community. Each College has a thriving social scene and its own sports teams; they help create a healthy sense of competition and college pride.

Our values come from our rich history, built on community, engagement and partnership, with a belief that no matter your background, we can help realise your ambitions.



Digby Stuart College

Digby Stuart College was first established in 1874 as a women's teacher training college. Today Digby Stuart is home to some of our newest facilities, including our Media Hub, Welcome Centre and Library.



Froebel College

Founded in 1892, the ethos of the College is based on the philosophy of Friedrich Froebel. The College is based within and around Grove House, which dates back to 1792.



Southlands College

Southlands College opened on 26 February 1872 as a training college for women teachers. The College is committed to the causes of equality, social justice and community engagement.



Whitelands College

Founded in 1841 as a teachers' training college, it is among the oldest higher education institutions in England, and one of the very first to provide education for women. Today it occupies a beautiful 14-acre site overlooking London's Richmond Park.

Social spaces

We have a range of bars, social spaces and catering outlets to suit all tastes. Our venues host events including club nights, live music and weekly markets. We have College Kitchens, so if you are commuting to campus you can store and heat up your food. There are plenty of opportunities for you to stay active through our on-campus gym and sports courts.



Excellent academic facilities

Disability and dyslexia services

If you have a disability, a long-term medical condition or a specific learning difference such as dyslexia, dyspraxia or ADHD, we offer specialist services if you ever need extra help. You can discuss your needs confidentially with our team, to explore the support you may need during your studies. We also offer regular appointments and drop-in sessions weekly.

English language support

Wellbeing support

Chaplaincy

Our multi-faith chaplaincy celebrates the diversity of Roehampton by serving the religious and spiritual needs of all. Each Chaplaincy Centre has a cosy lounge area, where you can relax, meet up with friends and enjoy chaplaincy hospitality with a Fairtrade tea or coffee. We also organise social events, including lunches and film nights.

Medical centre

We have our own on-campus NHS run student medical centre, offering doctor and nurse-led services throughout term time.

Student Wellbeing Officers

The Wellbeing Service is able to support you during your studies. The Student Wellbeing Officers can help with anything from dealing with personal issues to managing finances. There is also a Counselling Team to help you address personal or emotional difficulties. Roehampton is London's only green campus university and is surrounded by beautiful parks and gardens.

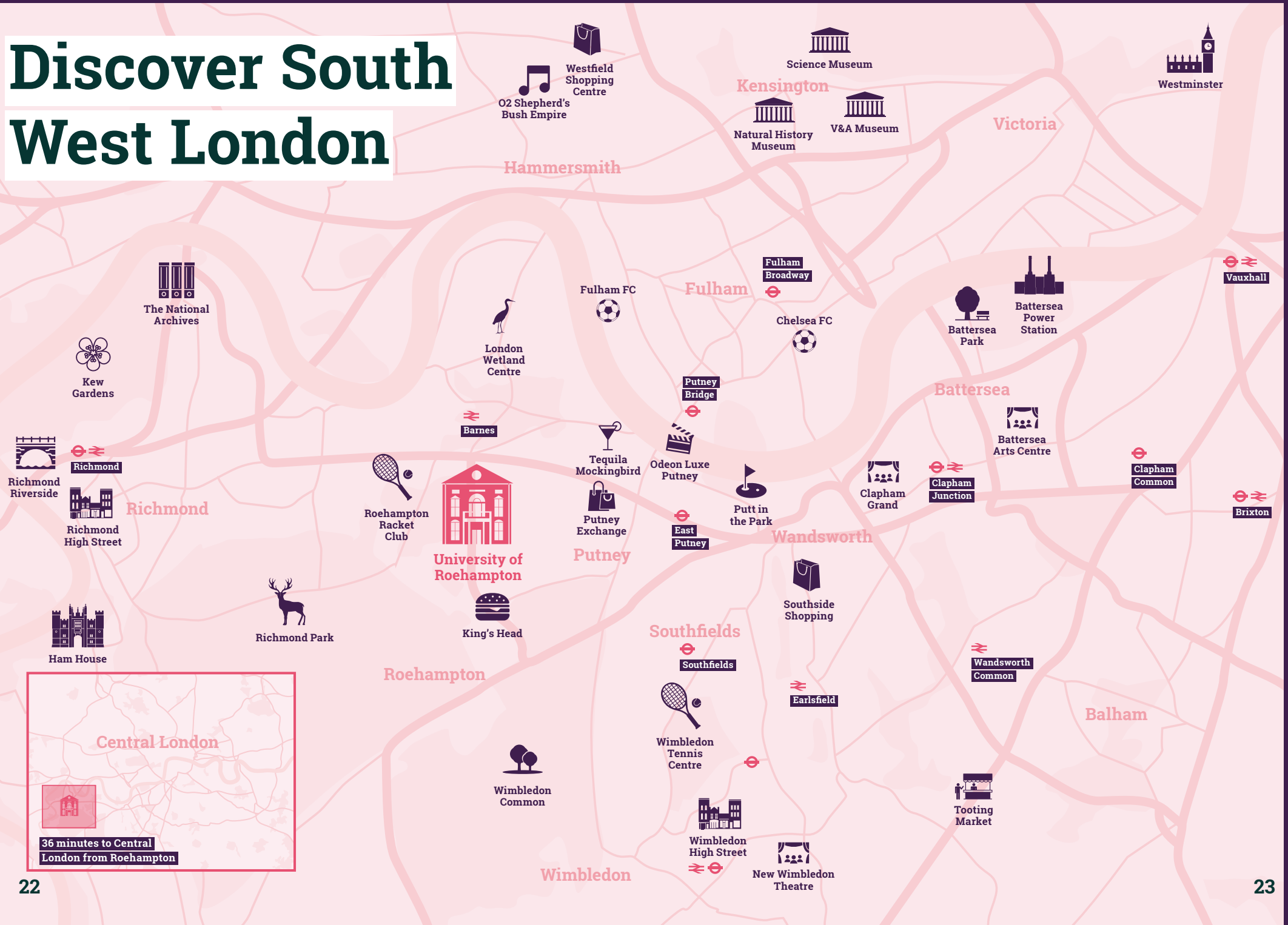
Richmond Park, with its herds of deer, iconic Isabella plantation and epic cycling routes, is a 5 minute walk from campus and free to enter.

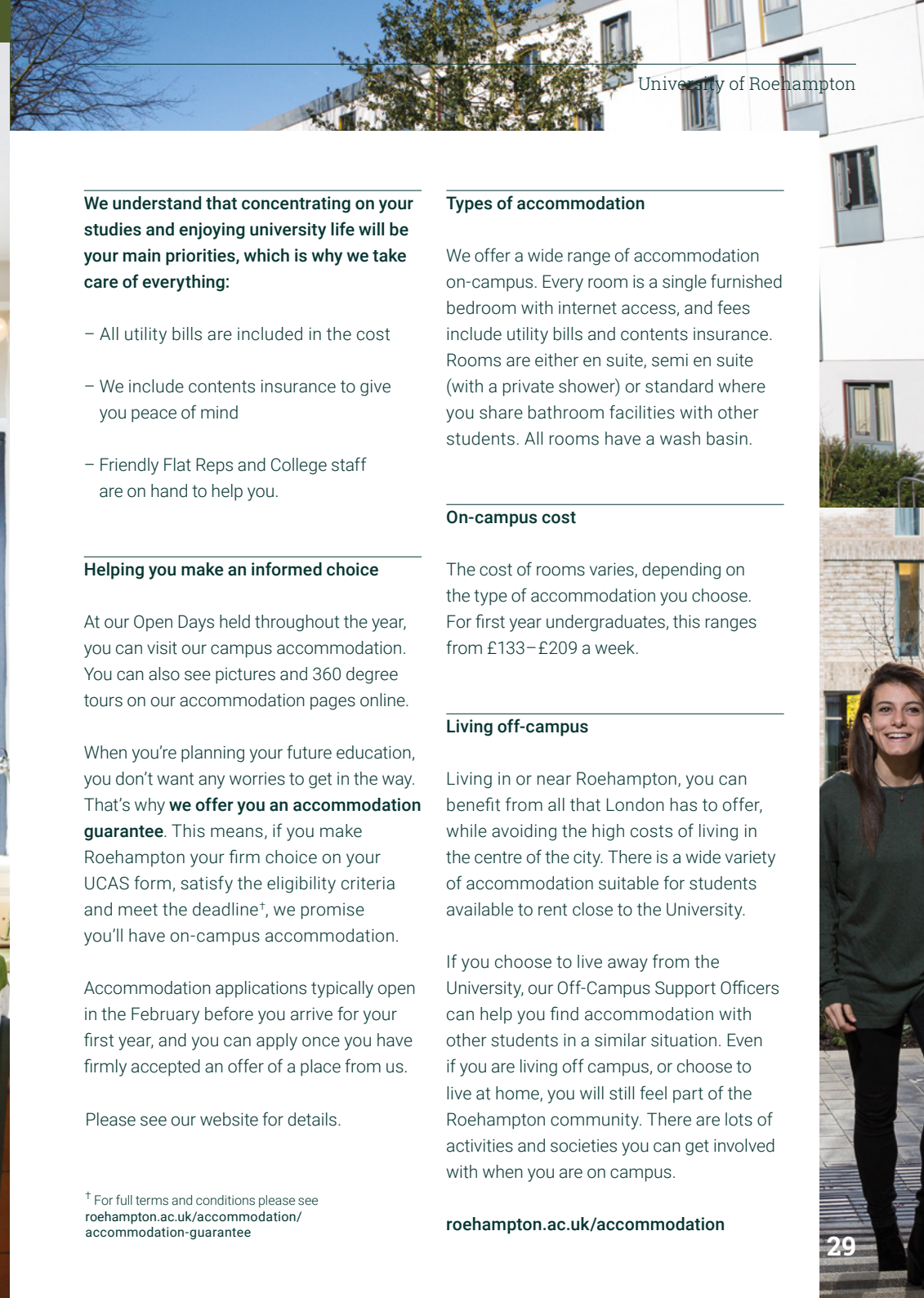


Summer Ball

Types of accommodation

We offer a wide range of accommodation on-campus. Every room is a single furnished bedroom with internet access, and fees include utility bills and contents insurance. Rooms are either en suite, semi en suite (with a private shower) or standard where you share bathroom facilities with other students. All rooms have a wash basin.

On-campus cost

The cost of rooms varies, depending on the type of accommodation you choose. For first year undergraduates, this ranges from £133–£209 a week.

Living off-campus

Living in or near Roehampton, you can benefit from all that London has to offer, while avoiding the high costs of living in the centre of the city. There is a wide variety of accommodation suitable for students available to rent close to the University.

If you choose to live away from the University, our Off-Campus Support Officers can help you find accommodation with other students in a similar situation. Even if you are living off campus, or choose to live at home, you will still feel part of the Roehampton community. There are lots of activities and societies you can get involved with when you are on campus.

Travel costs

This will vary depending on how often you travel, and which modes of transport you take. The Hopper fare in London allows you to make unlimited bus or tram journeys in one hour, for £1.65 using pay as you go. Commuting students

Roehampton is an inclusive and welcoming community for all students, whether you're living on campus, somewhere nearby or further afield. We are dedicated to continuously improving the student experience, whether that means providing a secure place to lock up your bike or round the clock access to academic advice.

We design our courses and services to support students commuting to campus. Our teaching resources are available online, we have 24/7 online careers and support services, and excellent transport links – including free bus services and student car parking – and facilities designed for students travelling in to campus.

Dedicated bus services

We have our own dedicated free student bus service, exclusively for our students and staff, that runs between Barnes and Wimbledon stations and stops at our main campus. This service runs approximately every twenty minutes and will connect you to London's tram and rail networks.

We benefit from being at the heart of a busy network of transport links, with around 20 buses an hour serving main campus, and even more running from Whitelands, so you can easily travel to Barnes station, Richmond, Putney, Clapham Junction and central London.

Flexible and online support services

We provide a wide range of support for all our students on and off campus:

- Online career support
- 24 hour online academic help and feedback available through Studiosity
- Huge range of online eBooks and resources you can access from home
- Our world-class library is open 24 hours a day in the run up to key points in the year
- Our Students' Union and Colleges run events specifically for off-campus students so you can access support and meet other students

Tube, train & cycling

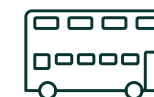
We're in TfL Zone 3, giving you plenty of options to get into central London:

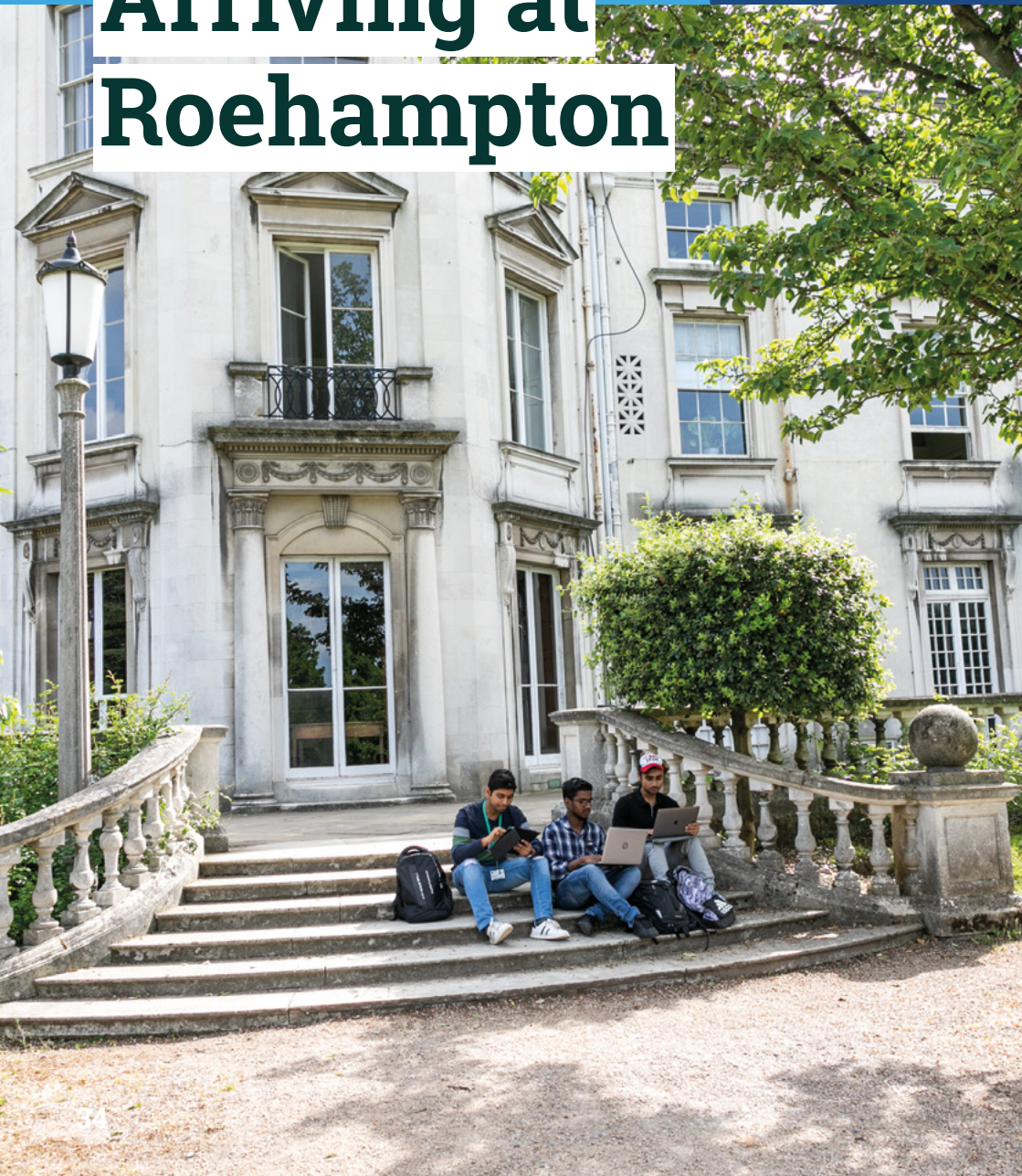

Please note: you will need UKVI IELTS, Persons or Trinity test results if you are applying for a single CAS for the International Foundation Programme. To be eligible to apply for a 4 Year CAS to cover both the International Foundation Programme and your undergraduate degree you will need to have an IELTS 5.5 (with a minimum of 5.5 in all elements).

Course overview

The International Foundation Programme is specifically designed to build your English language, academic study skills and subject knowledge to the level required to progress onto an undergraduate degree.

There are 3 different module combinations available for you to choose between:

What will I study?

3 term programme:

Throughout this term you will improve your language confidence levels in grammar and vocabulary as well as core English skills in reading, writing and listening to prepare you for the first term of the International Foundation Programme. You will only study term zero if you are on our three term programme.

3 & 2 term programme:

In terms one and two, you will continue to develop your English language skills, however, more of your time will be spent on improving your English language levels for subject specific undergraduate courses.

The modules of this programme are specifically designed to improve your ability to write essays, read for your studies, develop your ability to understand lectures, and take part in discussions and presentations and prepare you for undergraduate study.

How will I be taught?

- 20 hours teaching time in seminars and workshops
- 20 hours of independent study (25 for assessment weeks)
- 20–30 minute one-to-one tutorials during the project and subject modules

About the programme

- Study alongside other like-minded international students
- Gradually adjust to life in the UK and academic study

It gives you an opportunity to gradually familiarise yourself with the UK learning requirements in a supportive and encouraging environment, allowing you to develop and grow before joining year two of undergraduate study.

A key feature of studying the programme is that you become a full student of the Roehampton Business School and as such, you will be invited to join guest speaker events, conferences, staff student committees and have full access to all the facilities, software and materials to prepare you for your second year. This approach ensures that you feel part of the student community and gives you the opportunity to widen your academic and social friendship groups to develop long-lasting relationships within the University.

What will I study?

The modules you will study are mapped to those in Roehampton Business School undergraduate degrees and will develop your subject knowledge in areas such as management, marketing, accounting and analytics.

To join the Accounting degree you will study the 'Accounting for Organisations' module to prepare you for further exemptions for industry bodies such as ACCA and CIMA.

The Business Academic Skills module will support you throughout your journey, developing your skills in academic English, business language and everyday social English, to boost your confidence and language proficiency.

All modules allow you to apply academic theories to real life situations, and develop your critical thinking skills.

Progression to degree level study

Following successful completion of your programme, subject to a 40% pass mark, you will be able to progress onto the second year of all Roehampton Business School undergraduate degrees.

If you have the equivalent of IELTS 5.5 overall with no sub-score below 5.5 you will be able to apply for a joint CAS for the whole of your foundation and undergraduate study at Roehampton. This means you will only need to apply for your student visa once for your entire UK study with no additional English testing requirements.

By Bus

Buses run frequently to Roehampton from Richmond, Kingston, Putney, Clapham Junction, Wimbledon and New Malden.

The 265 and 493 buses stop next to the main site (at Queen Mary’s Hospital) and close to Whitelands and Mount Clare (at the junction of Danebury Avenue). The 170 and 430 buses stop on Danebury Avenue, which is very close to Whitelands and Mount Clare and a short walk from the main site.

By Train

The main site is a 10 minute walk from Barnes station, Whitelands College is a 25 minute walk or a short bus ride. Trains go to Barnes from Clapham Junction and Waterloo in one direction and Kingston, Richmond, Staines and Windsor in the other direction.

Putney Bridge, on the District Line, connects to the campus via the 265 bus, which departs from outside the station.
