
Learning to Learn is

'Learner' identity	'Consumer' identity
My degree is about belonging to an academic discipline and student group	My degree is like a product I would buy
I hope to have to think hard so that I can develop my understanding	I'm strongly focused on learning what will be useful to me in my career
If I put in the effort, I will be able to master the topics in my course	My degree is my best route to a well-paid job
If I don't learn, I need to work harder	If I do all my assignments, I deserve a good result
Learning is the most important thing for me	Marks are more important than learning



Two approaches to learning


Deep learning	Surface learning
Reads and studies widely and deeply	Reads and studies narrowly
Aims to understand the meaning behind the material	Aims to regurgitate the material
Connects new material to previous knowledge and beliefs	Learns subjects in isolation
Seeks to create new arguments and ideas from what they have learned	Seeks to repeat arguments of others accurately
Motivated internally by desire to learn or love of subject	Externally motivated by the need to pass assessments or gain grades
Thinks critically about what they have learned	Focuses on memorising necessary material without examining it



Examples of situations where surface learning might be more suitable


- > The evening before a test where there is a lot of content
- > Any other occasion when we only need to remember something for a short time
- ➤ If we do not regard the topic as important to us????

Identity, approach to learning, success and wellbeing

However, according to Taylor (2022),

- > Surface learning is associated with a strong consumer identity and lower academic achievement
- > Deep learning is associated with a strong learner identity, higher academic achievement and a strong sense of belonging to a student group and/or discipline.








